

**This June,** RUF students from TAMUCC joined together with members from Redeemer Presbyterian Church from San Antonio to serve on a



medical mission team at Isaiah 55 Ministries in Reynosa, Mexico. We began the week by worshiping at Camino de Fe, a Christian Reformed Church. On Monday, we held a clinic at

Isaiah 55's community center, where we saw and served over 50 patients. We prayed with every patient we saw. On Tuesday and Wednesday, we moved the clinic to <u>Senda de Vida</u>, a migrant shelter located about one mile from Isaiah 55. Senda de Vida was built to house up to 85 migrants at one time. The number of migrants living there currently

is over 475! RUF students translated for the physicians and other care providers, helped with triage, and served popcorn and raspas (shaved ice). Again, as on Monday, we served a large vol-



ume of patients, and prayed with each one of them. It is encouraging to see God using college students to spread his gospel to those along our Southern border!

## **WAVES OF WELCOME**

People often ask me what RUF does during the summer when school is not in session. The truth is that the summer is busier than the fall or spring semesters. In addition to attending Summer Conference and serving on the Reynosa mission trip, RUF at TAMUCC participates in twelve sessions of "Waves of Welcome," TAMUCC's Freshman Orientation.

During Waves of Welcome, current RUF students meet with incoming freshmen and have the opportunity to invite them to RUF Bible studies and social events. ## 2019 SUMMER CONFERENCE, PANAMA CITY BEACH

We began our summer by traveling to Panama City Beach, FL to take part in week 3 of RUF's annual summer conference. Summer Conference is the conference in which many RUF ministries from across the United States gather together for five days of fellowship, Bible study, worship, seminars, food, and the beach. This year's speaker was Russ Whitfield, senior pastor at Grace Mosaic Presbyterian Church (Washington D.C.). Russ is also the director of cross-cultural advance-

ment for RUF. Russ preached on sanctification each night during worship service. Individual seminars were taught by various RUF campus ministers, and covered topics such as sanctification, justification, prayer, sexuality, Christian worldview, and adoption.

Carson, Jerram Barrs, and John Piper. Prior to joining RUF, I never thought college students would be reading these authors.
